IRA CHARITABLE ROLLOVER IS SIGNED INTO LAW

The long-awaited tax advantaged charitable Tax Bill just passed Congress and has been signed by President Bush. If you have an IRA (Individual Retirement Account) and are older than 70½, you can now make a direct IRA gift of up to \$100,000 to a qualified charity like the Sholom Foundation without it becoming taxable income to you, in years 2006 and 2007.

This has significant benefits for people with large taxable income who get phased out of deductions

and exemptions; people who are on the bubble rates for taxable Social Security income; people who do not itemize; and people in the alternative minimum tax. AND, it qualifies for the Required Minimum Distribution amount you must take out each year after age 70½ without becoming taxable income.

It is now easier to support Sholom Foundation and also save on taxes.

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

The Sholom Foundation has had a very full plate over the last eighteen months. We undertook the dual task of not only raising endowment funds to support the Sholom Community Alliance facilities and programs, but raising capital funds for the new Rossy and Richard Shaller Family Sholom Campus in St. Paul as well.

During this period, our annual endowment fundraising goal was somewhat reduced to accommodate our capital campaign efforts.

I am very pleased to report that not only has over \$34 million been raised so far for the new campus in St. Paul, Sholom Foundation is on schedule to achieve our revised goal for endowments. But we must not be complacent. With the anticipated new facilities and programs — all created to better serve our growing elderly population — attaining the Foundation's long-range goal of a \$100 million endowment to support Sholom's facilities and programs must resume its previous pace and is more important than ever.

Are you one of the many in our Sholom community who has consistently supported the Sholom Ball over the years? Have you ever noticed the lovely aviaries and aquariums that give our residents of Sholom Homes East and West such pleasure? Do you know that the beauty shops at the Sholom homes provide our residents with over 4,000 washes, cuts, and “perms” each year? Which volunteer organization makes sure the residents of both Sholom nursing homes receive cheery holiday gifts throughout the year? Ever wonder how the Sholom Home Auxiliary manages to provide over \$260,000 in amenities, care and equipment for the nursing homes each year?

In fact, **everything** the Sholom Home Auxiliary has done to bring added services and comfort to the nursing homes residents for all these years could not have taken place without your annual financial support. Just look at the amenities and services provided by the Auxiliary on a yearly basis:

- Aviaries & Aquarium (\$7,500/year)
- Beauty Shops (\$22,000/year)
- Holiday gifts to residents (\$2,500/year)
- Service to Auxiliary members (\$2,000/year)
- *Chai Lites* newsletter (\$6,700/year)

- **Plus over \$230,000** in equipment and allocations to the nursing homes’ annual budget, the majority of which comes from the proceeds of the Sholom Ball, Silver Tea, and Auxiliary membership dues

After you are gone ...

Have you thought about what will happen after you are gone and the Sholom Home Auxiliary no longer receives your annual gift? You might want to consider making an endowment gift for the Sholom Home Auxiliary and ensure that your gift continues to provide support to our nursing home residents in perpetuity.

Five percent of your endowment will be allocated annually to the Sholom Auxiliary for whatever purpose you wish. Not only can you choose to endow a specific program, you can endow your annual tickets to the Sholom Ball, your gift to the Silver Tea, or your membership dues as well. (To determine your endowment donation, simply multiply the annual gift you wish to endow by twenty). For example:

A gift of \$20,000 will generate \$1,000 annually for the Sholom Ball at the “Guardian Angel” level.

A gift of \$12,500 will create an endowment fund that will generate \$625 annually to maintain the aviaries and aquariums for one month.

Remembering Mother

The Greenbergs understand the need for both “bricks and mortar” and securing the future of Sholom’s facilities and programs. They recently made a generous donation towards the new Sholom campus in St. Paul. That’s in addition to their Sholom Foundation Fund and a Charitable Gift Annuity that will benefit Sholom when they are gone. But if you express thanks to Larry and Ronya and ask why they give as much as they do, they defer the honorable mention and speak about honoring their families — the many relatives who have passed through the doors at Sholom over many decades — and most notably, they speak about Anne.

Larry’s mother, Anne Greenberg (nee Garon; her family was from Duluth), was extremely active in the Jewish community, and especially dedicated to the Sholom Homes. She felt a responsibility to the community, and Larry and Ronya have continued her passion.

Anne graduated from the University of Minnesota and worked as a social worker most of her adult life. Most notably, she supervised all nursing homes in Ramsey County, which is when she became more directly involved with Sholom. Says Ronya, “We admired her immensely. She was caring . . . she was helpful . . . the

most wonderful person I have ever known.”

The Greenberg association with

Sholom goes back as far as its founding days. A plaque at the old entrance to Sholom Home East lists the founding families for the then-called “Jewish Home for the Aged,” including Larry’s grandparents, Philip and Molly Greenberg.

Both Larry’s mother and father spent their last days in Sholom Homes — he in St. Paul and she in Minneapolis. When it was nearing time for Anne to need assistance, it was she who opted to go to Sholom. “She wanted to go there because she would know people there, and she knew she’d be well treated,” Larry remembers.

Donors like Larry and Ronya, who not only support Sholom’s capital campaign, but support Sholom’s future with endowment gifts as well, let us know the importance of both kinds of gifts. But if you ask Larry and Ronya, they’ll just tell you it’s all about Anne, “Whatever we do for Sholom, we do in her memory.”

IRA Charitable Rollover Signed Into Law

Extraordinary IRA Gift Opportunity for 2006-2007

A long-awaited piece of charitable legislation has finally been signed into law affording donors new charitable giving options through their IRAs. This opportunity will be for current IRA rollover gifts from individuals age 70½ and older for 2006 and 2007 only.

If you or a member of your family are over 70½ and have an Individual Retirement Account, you will want to keep reading:

■ If your circumstances are such that you do not need to use your IRA funds for living expenses, but must take a taxable annual distribution because you are over 70½, you may now rollover all or a portion of your IRA — up to \$100,000/year — directly to a charitable institution, such as Sholom Foundation, and avoid paying taxes on any of the rollover amount. Your IRA charitable gift will qualify toward your required minimum distribution as well. While there is no charitable income tax deduction in this case, by directing your IRA custodian to transfer your required minimum distribution directly to Sholom Foundation, you do not have to report it in your tax return and therefore, do not have to pay taxes on that amount.

■ For professionals and business owners, your IRA may even comprise the vast majority of your estate. You may need to do some “asset balancing” to avoid future income tax problems. Therefore it may be desirable for you to transfer up to \$100,000 per year directly to Sholom Foundation from your IRA, thus helping to “balance” your estate assets.

■ Depending on your level of income, you may receive tax benefits with an IRA gift under this provision. If you were to take your IRA annual distribution into your own personal income, you could be subject to losing exemptions that are phased out at higher income levels. Therefore, it would be preferable to make the gift directly from your IRA rather than making a charitable gift from regular income.

■ You may already be making charitable gifts up to 50% of your adjusted gross income, the maximum allowed for cash gifts each year. This new legislation allows you to give up to 50% of your adjusted gross income from your regular assets and then make “over and above” gifts from your IRA (not to exceed \$100,000 per year for 2006 and 2007). Since your IRA is not included in taxable income, it will have no impact on your regular income and other charitable gifts. In fact, some donors may, in effect, give 100% or more of their income per year through this method.

■ Since Social Security is subject to taxation at certain income levels, withdrawing an amount from your IRA can potentially cause your income to increase enough to make your Social Security income taxable. Therefore, transferring directly from your IRA to Sholom Foundation, may save you substantial taxes.

■ If you take a standard deduction on your income taxes because you do not have a mortgage and your medical deductions are less than 7.5% of your adjusted gross income, this legislation may afford you some taxable benefits. For instance, if you were to withdraw \$1,000 from your IRA and give it to Sholom, you would have to treat that \$1,000 as taxable income, and because you are taking the standard deduction, there would be no charitable deduction available to you for the gift. However, if you were to roll over your IRA gift directly to Sholom you would avoid the additional income tax otherwise payable on that \$1,000 withdrawal.

■ **REMEMBER:**

- Your charitable gift must be transferred to Sholom Foundation by your IRA custodian (do not take a

distribution from your IRA first and then donate it to a charity or you will be taxed on that distribution).

- You must be age 70½ or older.
- This provision applies only to 2006 and 2007 and has a \$100,000 maximum per year.
- The gift must be to a qualified exempt public charity such as Sholom Foundation and may not be made to philanthropic or donor advised funds, private foundations, or supporting organizations.

This new legislation opens up many new gift opportunities. We encourage you to consult your financial professional to determine how this charitable gifts provision may benefit both you and Sholom.

knishes at the State Fair booth and visiting Sholom residents, as she is soliciting gifts for the Foundation and the new Sholom campus in St. Paul. With boundless energy and commitment, Lisa steps in wherever she is needed, as exemplified by her offering the shelter of her umbrella to Annual Meeting attendees during a torrential downpour the night she was honored.

In accepting the award, Lisa proudly admitted that Susie Selcer, the “ultimate volunteer,” was her role model, making this honor all the more meaningful.

Did My Gift Bounce?

Imagine making a gift to Sholom Foundation and then opening the mail a few months later and finding a check from Sholom made out to you. If you didn't know better, you might call and say, "Hey, what's going on here? I gave you some money a while ago and now you're giving money back to me. What's wrong? Did my gift bounce?"

But you wouldn't make that call because you would have in your possession a signed agreement with Sholom Foundation entitling you to a fixed amount of money every year for the rest of your life. This agreement is called a **Charitable Gift Annuity (CGA)** and it is one of the most popular ways to support both yourself and the future work of Sholom.

Here's how it works: Max is 80 years old. After consulting with his financial advisor, he donates \$25,000 to Sholom Foundation and receives a gift annuity in return. Max's age (80) entitles him to receive a quarterly check in the amount of \$500, representing an annual annuity rate of 8% percent and an effective return rate of 11.7 percent (when compared to taxable investments). In addition to receiving regular fixed payments (partially tax free), Max will also receive an immediate income tax deduction for part of the donation.

How does Sholom benefit from this arrangement?

The \$25,000 is invested, using some of the investment income and some of the original \$25,000 to make quarterly payments to Max. After Max is gone, the balance remaining in his gift annuity is then made available to Sholom to use for the future.

Charitable gift annuities can be obtained for the donor or by the donor for someone else. They can be for one life or for two lives. They can be funded for any amount over \$5,000 with cash or marketable securities. Payments can begin soon after the gift is made, or years later at an even higher return rate (ask about a Deferred Charitable Gift Annuity).
