This is a call I have already made to Sholom, and many of my friends have done so as well. Thankfully, due to the wonderful financial support for the new campus, construction has already begun. I have been told that the Bentson Family Assisted Living Residence and Shirley Chapman Sholom Home East are expected to open in late 2008. Believe me, it won't be a moment too soon. Have you seen these projections?

- The population over 85 will increase from 5 million in 2005 to almost 7.5 million by the year 2020

**Sholom programs and facilities touch the lives of over 2,500 elderly clients, residents and tenants every year.** In the 50 years I have been involved with Sholom — starting with the George Kaplan Sholom Home on Randolph — I have seen the number of individuals and families served by Sholom dramatically increase. With the new campus and the increasing

**Sholom will have good hospice care... that's what's important.**

on expanding hospice care in the Twin Cities that he and his family decided to establish one of their own.

Then, through conversations with friend and neighbor Allen Freeman, President of the Sholom Community Alliance, Lynn learned that the new Sholom campus did not yet include plans for a hospice, or for any specific hospice care. So Lynn's attention shifted to Sholom. Through his generous gift — plus considerable discussion and some prodding — the Johnson Center for hospice care is becoming a reality.

“Sholom has always done good work,” Lynn states matter-of-factly. His father was on the Sholom Board of Directors in the 1940's, and Lynn has known many people who've resided at Sholom. “There would not be a hospice care center if it was not for Lynn's vision and understanding of the importance to provide hospice care under the auspices of the Sholom Community Alliance,” says Allen Freeman.

The Johnson Center for hospice care will occupy the top floor of the new Shirley Chapman Sholom Home East, and will provide hospice services for up

to twelve individuals and their families at one time. In addition to the hospice care center on campus, there will be a hospice agency that will provide hospice care in peoples' homes, where many people prefer to spend their final days. “Most importantly, it's open to anyone who needs it,” states Lynn. “That's key in my mind.”

A “family-first” man, Lynn and his brother, Mitchell, established their St. Paul business, Johnson Brothers Liquor Company, in 1953. Lynn and his wife of fifty years, Gloria Herman Johnson, have four children — Todd, Michael, Brad and Robin. Altogether, they have 11 grandchildren.

The Johnson family has lived in St. Paul since 1885 with deep philanthropic roots as well. Involved with Jewish organizations from the beginning, the Johnson's special attention has gone to the Jewish Community Center and Talmud Torah (the Preschool was built by the Johnson family to honor Lynn's sister, Gayle Johnson Cohen).

“Sholom will have good hospice care,” Lynn repeatedly states, “and that's what's important, not me.”

## New IRA Charitable Gift Law Clarified to Include Up to \$100,000 Gift from Spouse

Last year, Congress passed a law allowing IRA owners who are at least 70½ to give a charity up to \$100,000 a year from their regular IRAs or Roths. Such payouts are tax free and can be used to satisfy minimum-payout rules. New guidance clarifies that for couples, each can transfer up to \$100,000 from their individual accounts. And IRA owners won't run afoul of rules on direct transfers if they deliver a check made payable to the charity. Remember that the law allowing these transfers is set to lapse after 2007.\*

***IMPORTANT: Your IRA trustee or custodian must make your IRA gift payable to “Sholom Foundation,” (the Sholom entity that is accepting qualified IRA tax-free contributions under this new law). Your gift will be used for the purpose that you have designated including the Sholom East Campus Capital Campaign. What do you get when a group of bright and talented older adults join forces under the guidance of an extraordinary teacher and mentor?

*Voices . . . where the lifelong among us speak . . .*

This quarterly publication, of over 50 pages and written in its entirety by Knollwood Place residents, embodies the intelligence, humor, and spirit of every writer in the group. *Voices* is edited by energetic octogenarian Evelyn Shore who moved from the East Coast to Knollwood Place three years ago. An educator, who is still teaching her textbook *Position Paper Writing* online for Concordia University, Evelyn is hard at work enriching people's lives at Knollwood Place.

*Voices* is an outgrowth of Evelyn's brainchild — a writing class at Knollwood that began two years ago. People came to her class by many different paths. Pearl Perlman took a chance, saying she hadn't been to school since she graduated in the class of 1926. Pearl persuaded Bernice Cowl Gordon, longtime Sholom volunteer and applicant for campus residency at a future time, to come to a wonderful class that was stimulating her elderly mind!

Lester Seglin, who did technical writing during the course of his career, always wanted to try his hand at a more creative writing style, while Fanny Schanfield, who has published many of her own writings, came to Evelyn for a critique of her latest project and decided to stay. Over the past two years, more than a dozen individuals have joined Evelyn's writing class, bringing an abundance of ideas and life experiences along with a willingness to challenge themselves to become writers.

Everyone on the *Voices* staff has taken Evelyn's "refresher" course, honing their writing skills, tackling everything from writing memoirs and sightseeing observations to creating stories about subjects Evelyn would assign. Then, having received a certificate of completion, each of the writing students joined the staff of *Voices* and became regular contributors.

Evelyn Shore respects her writers while at the same time letting them know she has high expectations. There is an air of professionalism and pride when this staff meets. Mutual regard and enthusiasm for each other's writing becomes the order of the day. The respect given to the master copy work and Evelyn's graphic design, together with the longhand transcription support of resident Joan Hansen and assistance from Alliance staff Pamela Gusdal, Irit Vinitsky, and Sharon Tholkes, is always recognized as crucial to success.

"People think that because we're senior citizens we're *over the hill*," comments 99-year-old youngster Helen Pitzele, who confidently assures us "we're still very much alive!"

Each writer on the staff has his or her own voice and inimitable style as evidenced when the writers read their own work out loud. "I would never give this up," asserts Geraldine Fineberg, who had the entire group chuckling as she read her short flash-piece about a conversation with a chimpanzee.

Natalie Atkins, whose interview of Roitenberg resident Hy Berman was published in the February *Voices*, says, "Writing is an extension of my mind. When I interview a person, I am a good listener."

"I wasn't a writer, but the class challenged me," comments Naomi Birger. "Writing for *Voices* permits me to share what I think and who I am with my children and grandchildren."

"Evelyn is a wonderful teacher, and I value her opinion," says Belle Krantz, whose travel piece on the Seattle Pike Market had everyone visualizing fish vendors tossing fish from stall to stall over the heads of passersby. Belle did three revisions for Evelyn before her piece was approved for publication.



“All of us agree that we are very fortunate to have someone of Evelyn’s caliber to teach and guide us,” offered Beverly Davis. Lorraine Reichel marvels at Evelyn’s teaching style: “She has the ability to bring out our writing skills, drawing from us some kind of undiscovered talent.” According to Bernice Cowl Gordon, “I enjoy the group so much that Tuesday is the highlight of my week.”

So far, Evelyn has brought together a staff of twelve for *Voices*, and she will be starting another “refresher” writing class this coming June with hopes of drawing new students from Roitenberg as well as from Knollwood Place.

The Sholom Community Alliance strongly supports the *Voices* project. Michael Klein, chief operating officer, notes “I have been simply amazed at the high quality of writing which Evelyn and her group have produced. We freed up some programming funds to support the quarterly publication of *Voices*, and we will continue to look at other venues to help foster the intellectual stimulation of our tenants.”

Already, *Voices* has received its first contribution from Naomi Birger in order to subsidize its production budget. Evelyn’s goal is to see an endowment fund established that can ensure the continuation of this project. She is certain that the work of the staff writers must continue to be published for others to read. “If it isn’t in print, it’s not a concrete confirmation of what our authors are capable of creating and contributing.”

In fact, Evelyn is not content just to teach her writing class and edit *Voices*. Always thinking about ways to encourage intellectual growth, her ultimate goal is to establish an Academy on campus, one at which not only her writing class would be offered, but a regular schedule of other scholarly activity as well.

“We could utilize the talents of the emeritus professors in the Metro area to conduct classes in a variety of intellectual, artistic, and vocational pursuits,” she muses. While acknowledging that a project of this scope will take both staff and financial resources, she is confident that financial support will be forthcoming as people are made aware of the positive impact such a project can have on the Sholom community. She envisions The Academy as a prototype for other elder adult residences around the country.

The Reverend Samuel A. Baker Religious Activities Fund was created in his memory by his son, the late Michael H. Baker. Now from a third generation, Zachary M. Baker lovingly writes of his grandfather, who spent the last few months of his life at Sholom East:

*My grandfather was an observant Jew who eked out a living as a Hebrew teacher, bar mitzvah coach, Torah reader, cantor, and — on occasion — congregational rabbi.*

*When I was 20 years old, he tutored me in Yiddish for an entire summer. After my father passed away I inherited my grandfather's parchment diploma dated 1912 from the Teachers' Institute of the Jewish Theological Seminary of America, and it now serves as a reminder of his bedrock commitment to the teachings and practices that gave meaning to his own life and those of his fellow Jews.*

*It is of course in that spirit that the Religious Activities Fund that bears his name was established.*



## Deferred Charitable Gift Annuities: Good Tools for Retirement Planning

In addition to regular charitable gift annuities, Sholom Foundation now offers deferred charitable gift annuities. These can be powerful tools for retirement planning, especially if you would like to support Sholom Foundation but want to be sure that you receive regular income in your retirement.

In exchange for a gift of cash or appreciated assets, you can receive fixed payments for the rest of your life beginning a year from now, or in five, 10, 15 or even 20 years. Depending on your age at the time of your gift and the length of time you defer your first payment, you can receive a fixed rate ranging from 5.0 % to 21.0% or more.

For example, if you receive a deferred charitable gift annuity in exchange for a gift to Sholom when you are 55 and defer the receipt of your first annual payment until you are 65, you would receive an annual return of 9.9%. Wait another five years to receive your first payment and the rate increases to 13.8%.

You also will be eligible for a charitable deduction at the time of your gift, and you will even reduce your estate taxes.

## Volunteering: Finding the Right Fit\*

I am interested in doing some volunteer work when I retire next year but I want to find something meaningful to do. Do you have any recommendations on how to find interesting volunteer opportunities?*

Volunteering is a great way for retirees to stay socially connected as well as make a positive contribution to their community — but how can you find the right opportunity to satisfy your needs and interests? Here are some tips that may help.

### The Right Fit

For many retirees, finding the right kind of volunteer work is a lot like finding the right job or career. Remember what that was like? Depending on how serious you are, it will likely take some work and persistence, and you may even go through several volunteer jobs before finding one you like. To get started, here are some questions to ask yourself that may help point you in the right direction.

- What inspires you? (It might sound obvious, but few volunteers actually take time to reflect on what really matters to them.)
- What types of activities are you interested in?
- How much time can you give – once a week, a few times a month, or every so often?
- What kind of skills can you bring to a volunteer organization?
- What types of new skills or knowledge (if any) would you like to acquire?
- Where and how do you want to serve?

- What do you want to gain from your experience (for example, meet new people, learn new skills, help those in need, exposure to a particular issue)?
- **Savvy Tip:** While most nonprofit organizations need and want volunteers, they likely haven't thought of every way possible to use an individual's donated time and skills. If you have a unique idea or special skill you'd like to offer, talk with the organization you're interested in. You may be able to create your own volunteer position.

Volunteering has more benefits than you may realize. Through volunteer service, you not only strengthen and improve the quality of life within your community, you can also help yourself and others to live happier, healthier and more productive lives. In fact, several studies suggest that seniors who volunteer regularly actually live longer and have fewer medical problems.
